When we are satisfied that we have given steps one through five our best effort and have identified the most glaring defects of character and shortcomings, it is now time to affect the changes in the most obvious of our faulty thoughts and the behaviors that stem from those thoughts by addressing them in steps six and seven. To be successful in this endeavor, we must first get honest with ourselves and begin to establish some credibility and by that, I mean always doing the things we say we are going to do. We bring most of the basic flaws out in the open as we become aware of them. Then, if we are sure that we are committed to the program, we will want to set in place principles to live by that cut off our own escape when we stumble and want to revert to that old way of thinking. Most of us do this with the help of a sponsor or

a mentor,

if you like, and go by the book as best we can.



Pamphlet OF THE MONTH: The Twelve Traditions Illustrated

"As newcomers, many of us say to ourselves, "Let the group officers worry about the Traditions. I'm just an average member. They're rules for running groups, aren't they? And everybody tells me, 'There are no rules in A.A.'!" Then we look closer — and find that the Traditions are not rules — and they are not just for officers. They have deep meaning for each one of us, as the Twelve Steps do. Like the Steps, the Traditions were not figured out in advance, as courses of action against future problems. The action came first. Pioneer A.A. groups, with nothing to go on except the trial-and-error-and-try-again method, soon discovered: "Well, that way didn't work. But the other one did. And this one works even better!" Both successes and failures were reported in letters to A.A. headquarters (eventually to become the General Service Office). In went these shared experiences of A.A.'s first 10 years, and out came the Twelve Traditions. In 1946, then in the "long form," they were published in the A.A. Grapevine. By 1950, they had been condensed to their present form and were adopted by A.A.'s First International Convention."



In Person and Online Meeting on Thursday, July 11th, 2024 @ 7:00 pm

Jonathan, Council Chair opened the 945th Coordinating Council Meeting with a moment of reflection followed by the "Responsibility Pledge"

Guest Reports:

Area 8 Representative: Adrian, Area Alt Delegate submitted his report remotely:

I am sorry that I could not be with you all tonight. I am currently in Las Vegas through Sunday 7/14 for the Pacific Regional Forum. For those not familiar, a Regional Forum is where members from the General Service Board, A.A.W.S., and A.A. Grapevine Inc. come to the region that is hosting the event to make Panel presentations and interact with the A.A. members in that region. My first Forum experience really brought everything that takes place in New York into full focus for me. The Area is working on finalizing it's 2025 Budget. This budget will be presented at the Big Day Assembly on September 28th for the GSRs to obtain a Group Conscience on to be voted on at the November Budget Assembly. I am personally working on an Agenda Item for next years General Service Conference, which I will inform you more on when I see you in August.



"Dr. Bob CITED another POINT of identification, the ASSOCIATION of both with the OXFORD Group, 'BILL in New York, for five MONTHS, and I in AKRON, for two and a half YEARS.' But there was a SIGNIFICANT difference: 'Bill had ACQUIRED their idea of SERVICE. I had not.' This idea, which Bill BROUGHT and Dr. BOB never FORGOT, was put into ACTION immediately. They STARTED trying to help VET another DRUNK. In a LETTER to Lois, Bill noted that he was WRITING from the OFFICE of "one of my new FRIENDS," Dr. Smith, who "had my TROUBLE." He said TOGETHER they were WORKING to "CHANGE" a once-prominent SURGEON who had developed into a "terrific RAKE and drunk." . . . Bill's letter was dated May 1935, and thus shows they

had started carrying the MESSAGE together at least within two WEEKS or so of their first meeting." Page 70, Reprinted with permission from A.A.W.S.


A.A. Economics



Book of the Month: Dr. Bob and The Good Oldtimers

"This shows, not only how emphasis differed from one area to another, but how groups were beginning to adopt customs that gave them a distinctly local flavor. Years later, Eastern A.A.'s would be just as "shook up" when Los Angeles members responded to their identification at a meeting with a loud "Hi, Joe!" Ed B. recalled that Dr. Bob, always the accomplished storyteller, had a tale to fit every occasion, including this topic of local variations. "You know," Ed said, "you go to another part of the country, and they operate in a

different way, and you come back and say, 'If I had to go by their kind of A.A., I could never stay sober.' Well, that happened to an Akron member when Dr. Bob was alive," said Ed. "I remember Dr. Bob told the fellow the story of

this American who was putting flowers on a friend's grave while a Chinese man was putting food on his friend's grave. The American thought that was funny. 'When do you expect your friend to come up and eat that food?' he asks. And the Chinese guy says, 'When your friend comes up to smell those flowers.' I did what I thought was a thorough job of it, then one day, about thirty years ago, I was trying to park my car in a somewhat crowded parking lot and as I found the spot, I wanted there was a shopping cart blocking my way. I got out of my car and moved the cart aside, then parked my car. I then got that shopping cart and pushed it back to the store entrance, then went about my business. From that day on, when parking at any market, I search for a stray shopping cart and take it back to the store just to make up for all the times I shoved one into the flower bed and drove away. After telling that story at meetings over the years, I hear people telling how it is uncomfortable for them to leave the cart adrift in the parking lot, and we all get a big laugh out of it. Neglect, I can tell, the word neglect is only mentioned two times in the Big Book (pg. 97 and pg. 129) and two times in the 12&12. (pg. 81 and pg. 151) And seldom, if ever, has it been the topic of a meeting that I can recall.

It is like the proverbial *elephant in the room*. As I started to catch myself shirking my responsibilities it became obvious to me that if I wanted to regain some form of self-respect and dignity, I was going to have to put the word *Neglect* on my list of shortcomings and *question my integrity*. Do I do what is right even when there is no one watching? If credibility is *always doing what I say I am going to do, then Integrity,* to me, is *a whole bunch of credibility*. To cut off my own escape I do routine things every day, that cost me nothing and the result of that is a clear conscience.

If I am doing the little things that I should, I find it much easier to give the big things


that same sort of attention. I never throw trash out of the car window, I pick up after myself, I never walk away from my bed in the morning without making it, and I liken that to being an unspoken prayer saying, I will be responsible, I will be orderly, I will be neat, and I will not be neglectful, I will be respectful, I will stay on the unselfish side of the ledger in all of my decisions, I sometimes revisit those pages in the Big Book and the 12&12 and I try my best not to ignore *the elephant in the room*.

It is in the combining of these three concepts that I began to feel a peace and calm in me. A clarity in the importance of getting freed from the bondage of self and giving control to God. I pictured certain elements of nature- the vastness, depth and power of the ocean, the infiniteness of the night sky, the life that the forests and deserts hold...all of these segments of nature that the Creator has made all show us no attachment-the ocean ebbs and flows, is calm and storms; the constellations that light up the night sky change their position in the sky as the earth rotates and as the seasons change; the trees and grass go from frozen to green to brown over and over again and the desert air can be as hot as fire to cold as ice to dry as sand to pouring rain.

But nature does not attach to this...it does not dwell on the past or future. It knows this moment right now is all there is and it must be accepted for this moment too will pass and the next moment needs to be accepted. Nature shows us reliance on its Maker as we must also rely. We are also creations of this Designer of the Universe and we also are not mistakes. Perhaps nature was made to be so beautiful so we would observe it, be captivated by it and maybe follow its lead. The mountain does not tell its Creator when it is time to be covered in snow, it stands there majestically, accepting each season as it

And rendered me devoid of any need to have a drink.



comes and as it goes, it knows that it does not need to attach to anything, it needs only to rely the Creator's timing and trust that the snow will come when it is supposed to. I think I only get to find this flow when I let go of attachment, accept what is right now, and trust in the timing and plan of my Higher Power.
